SCIENTIFIC CURRICULUM VITAE:

Daniele Mascanzoni received the degree in Nuclear Engineering at the Politecnico in Milan in 1973 and the Ph.D. in Radioecology at the University of Uppsala (Sweden) in 1988, where he worked as a researcher and later as Head of Research. In 1990 he was appointed Scientific Attaché at the General Consulate of Sweden in Milan where he worked until 1994, when he became first professor and then full professor of Applied Ecology at the School of Engineering at the University of Basilicata. He is the author of numerous scientific publications and attended in many seminars and conferences throughout the world, thus creating a wide network of contacts in the international scientific community. He is a referee for the scientific journal Environmental Pollution and has contributed to the report on the transfer of radioactive substances from the environment to the food chain on behalf of the European Union. He is a member of ESNA (European Society on New Methods in Agriculture), IUR (International Union of Radioecologists) and he has been a member of the Scientific Committee of the Swedish Government to study the environmental impact of the Chernobyl nuclear accident. He has cooperated with the IAEA (International Atomic Energy Agency) for developing new environmental models and has been coordinator of several projects funded by the European Union and the Swedish Research Council.
